



1) What is a Light The Night Community or School Walk?

Light the Night Community and School Walks provide the opportunity for local teams of friends, families, students or communities to hold their own [Light The Night Walk](#) on a date and location that is most convenient for them. These walks are held independently of the [11 Nationally hosted](#) Light The Night Walks across Canada.

The walk can be lead or “hosted” by any volunteer in the local community or school, and will be supported by regional staff at The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society of Canada, by supplying administration, team building and fundraising coaching.

2) How do I host my own Light The Night Walk?

If you are interested in hosting a Light The Night Walk in your community or school, please contact your [regional Light The Night Staff](#).

If you are in an area where a Community or School Walk is already being organized, we can put you in contact with the lead local volunteer.

3) Once I register, then what?

Once you contact your regional staff to register your team, you will be given a link to your personal fundraising page, and a username and password. You can customize this page with photos and text, and share with donors to sponsor you in your fight for a cure.

4) What are the expectations for a Light the Night Community or School Walk?

Date: The Nationally hosted Light the Night Walks are currently held in the fall each year. You are welcome to add your Community or School Walk during this time, or confirm a date that best fits your needs.

Start Time: Recommended early evening (after sunset) for the illuminated lanterns to have greatest effect.

Participation: There is no charge to walk, however fundraising is encouraged. For Community Walks, a minimum contribution of \$100 is required for a walker to receive a Lantern and Champion for Cures T-shirt. Continue to fundraise and earn even more official Light The Night Walk gear.
